備註	 Students must complete in total of 30 credits for graduation, of which 4 credits should be from required courses, 20 credits from core optional courses. Free credits are 6 credits, and the free credits mentioned in the preceding paragraph are principle to the courses offered by the master's programs of the Schools of Humanities and Social Sciences. The major electives in this class are divided into four modules: "Administrative Management", "Policy Innovation", "Cultural Governance" and "Social Innovation". Master students who select 3 or more courses in the module according to the annual curriculum planning table, and who have passed the grades, can submit an application to the school office with the module certificate application form and transcript. This class also admits for cross-study the master's class courses of School of Humanities and Social Sciences. Academic Ethics are required courses for 0 credits. In accordance with Regulations of KNU Academic Ethics Courses, students could applied for academic degree oral defense after passing the academic ethics courses. Master students in this class must complete their studies in accordance with the study regulations of this class, and must write a graduation thesis and pass the examination. The graduation thesis is not included in the graduation credits. The relevant courses of the graduate students of the Department of Public Affairs and Management enrolled before (inclusive) the 2021(the 110th year of the Republic of China)academic year may be recognized or credited with the courses offered after the 2023(the 112th year of the Republic of China) academic year (inclusive). This curriculum planning table was approved by the Curriculum Committee the School of Humanities and Social Sciences on Aug 28th, 2023. These courses regulations were passed at the Curriculum Committee Meeting on Sep 12th. 2023, and approved for future references by Academics Affairs Mee
